

Ph.D. ADMISSION PROCESS AND SEATS

I. For UGC-JRF, NET candidates and Foreign Nationals

- (i) The candidates with fellowship/ scholarship in UGC-JRF, candidate with valid NET score in **category 2 and 3, as notified by the Public Notice No.F.4-1 (UGC-NET Review Committee/ 2024 (NET)/ 140648 on March 27, 2024** and foreign nationals are exempted from appearing in the Entrance Test.
- (ii) JRF- qualified students and foreign nationals shall be admitted through evaluation of research proposal followed by interview/ viva-voce. The weightage of each component shall be as follows:
 - a) Research Proposal: 50%
 - b) interview/ viva-voce: 50%
- (iii) The candidates who qualify in category 2 and 3, 70% weightage will be given for test scores and 30% weightage for the interview/ viva-voce.
- (iv) The candidate should also score a minimum of 50% marks in the evaluation of research proposals and interview/viva-voce to qualify for the final selection,
- (v) NLUJ may decide the number of eligible students to be called for an interview based on the number of Ph.D. seats available.

II. For National Level Entrance Test applicants

The admission process comprises of two stages.

- (i) The first stage of the two stage evaluation process is a written entrance test and the second stage is the evaluation of research proposals followed by interview/ viva-voce.
- (ii) The weightage of the two components shall be as follows:
 - a) Entrance Test: 70%
 - b) Research and interview/viva-voce: 30%
- (iii) The entrance test paper shall contain 50% of the questions from Research Methodology and the remaining 50% shall be from subject specific i.e., Law, Humanities and Social Sciences, Management.
- (iv) The candidate shall secure a minimum of 50% marks in the first stage i.e., entrance test to qualify for the second stage.
- (v) The candidate should also secure a minimum of 50% marks (45% in case of SC/ST/OBC/non-creamy layer, Differently-Abled candidates, EWS) in the evaluation of research proposals and interview/viva-voce to qualify for the final selection.
- (vi) NLUJ may decide the number of eligible students to be called for an interview based on the number of Ph.D. seats available.

(vii) A relaxation of 5% will be allowed in the entrance examination for the candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/ Differently–Abled, Economically Weaker Section (EWS) and other categories

Total Number of Ph.D. Seats: 18

- Ph.D. in Law: 6 seats for UGC- JRF, NET and NLUJ Entrance Test and 2 Seats for Foreign Nationals
- Ph.D. in Humanities & Social Sciences viz., Economics, Political Science, Sociology, History and English: 6 seats for UGC-JRF, NET and NLUJ Entrance Test
- Ph.D. in Management: 4 seats for UGC- JRF, NET and NLUJ Entrance Test
